"2019" marked the 15th Anniversary for NWTFC and we were presented a 15-year certificate at the June FMCA Rally in Albany. I wish to thank our original founding members for their efforts in laying the groundwork to such a successful gathering of RV owners with a common bond. Several of those founding members are still involved with our chapter activities and continue to contribute greatly to the enjoyment we derive from NWTFC.

The club membership is holding steady around 80 coaches with some old friends leaving and new friends joining. The numbers speak a lot to the quality of the TREK motorhomes and the fun people that own them. It seems there will be a dues increase for FMCA membership this year. It was decided by the board of directors that the increased cost of FMCA Assist was worth the service it provides. I believe they are investigating ways to reduce the cost of this service in the future. Membership in FMCA is required to be a member of NWTFC so this may affect our membership numbers.

We had two great rallies in 2019 and unfortunately our fall rally did not happen due to circumstances.

Looking forward to this year!!! The 2020 FMCA Northwest Regional Rally will be at the Roseburg OR at the Douglas County Fairgrounds in June. We have not held a FMCA area rally there before, so it will be a chance to see a new area. Al and Elaine Zimmerman along with Tom and Jolene Selvidge are putting together a pre-rally in the area. At the moment that is the only 2020 rally in the books for the club. Any ideas????

As many of you know a vote was taken in May on acquiring an AED for the club. The purchase was approved by a vote of 17 yes and 12 no. The board decided to try raising the money to purchase an AED with donations from the membership so as not to deplete the treasury. The fund is currently around \$270.00 and the amount required is close to \$1000. We will need to revisit this again.

The Quartzite Trek gathering will have either happened or be close when this is read. I hope a good time is enjoyed by all and I am sorry to miss it. Looking forward to another great year of RVing.

BC days is a three-day weekend long celebration. The Comox Valley is a four-season vacation spot. The farmers market was as good as it gets. They also had two craft fairs that were unbelievable. Both fairs had very high quality and unique items. The food was also very good. The RV park had a bocce ball tournament which was won by Ron Morehouse who was with us.

This was Peter and Beth's first rally, and they did a great job. We had 14 couches from as far away as Pueblo Colorado. Eight of the coaches were from the United States.

In 2020 we only have the Umpqua 2020 Rally in Sutherlin, Oregon. This is a pre-rally to the FMCA NW Area Rally in Roseburg. We need people to step up and host a rally. We were hoping to do another Port Townsend rally this year, but they would not answer their phone or call me back. I only called 30 plus times and left many messages. National Director Al Zimmerman

The spring planning meeting for the FMCA NW Area was held in April at the Linn County Fairgrounds in Albany, Oregon. The key focus of this meeting was planning the FMCA NW Area Rally in Albany in June. NW Trek Fun Club staffed the store for the area rally. Many thanks for all the volunteers who helped make the store run smoothly.

There was a call for chapters to revise their bylaws to change the terminology for motorhome to recreational vehicles. NWTFC had already taken this step, so the Trek Club is ahead of the game.

The number of coaches attending the Albany NW Area Rally was lower than in the past. Some of the RV dealers are indicating that unless they get an exclusive deal as the only dealer with display coaches they will not be a vendor at FMCA r allies. Effective marketing and growing the attendance at area rallies is becoming a challenge.

16 coaches from the northwest caravanned together to the North Dakota State Fairgrounds for the 100th International Convention of FMCA from a school parking lot a few miles outside Minot. Others from the northwest were parked in other areas of the fairgrounds. The interest among northwest attendees was raised because Kathie Balogh was running for national secretary. The official count of attendees was 1,688 family RVs with 489 first-time attendees.

The main business session was the Governing Board meeting on Wednesday. It was thought that this year's meeting would be relatively uneventful, but it did not turn out that way. One of the key issues was FMCAssist – the emergency medical assistance program that is a benefit for all FMCA members. An informal poll was taken of delegates indicating that about 90% definitely wanted to keep the program.

Two problems have arisen regarding the FMCAssist program:

- When the program was adopted in 2014, the program premiums were funded from FMCA reserves (investments). Since 2015 over \$2.1 million have been taken from reserve funds to cover the premiums.
- 2) Seven Corners, the insurance company administering the FMCAssist program, has announced a significant premium increase for the next fiscal year. The company indicated that premium payments (based on a per member per month charges) are not covering the costs of administering the program.

A way had to be found to cover the premium cost from current operating revenue, reimburse the reserve fund withdrawals, and cover the additional premium cost.

Based upon recommendations from the treasurer, Al Zimmerman moved to amend the budget by increasing the annual dues by \$25 per year effective September 1, 2019. Jim deBorg of the Northwest Area seconded the motion to amend the budget. After significant discussion, the 2020 budget was adopted.

Dues will increase to \$75 per year. Though this was a significant dues increase, it was realized that the cost of a similar program (FMCAssist) would cost significantly more on the open market.

Members overwhelmingly wanted to keep FMCAssist as a member benefit. That dues increase was also necessary because of the number of members who have prepaid their dues for a number of years.

President Jon Walker reported that 24 of the past 25 months have shown positive increases in FMCA membership. Several delegates indicated that FMCAssist was a key factor in the recruitment of new members and the retention of current members.

Elections were held and the following officers were elected to two-year terms:
