Members Helping Members Dean Bjornson

I was at the end of my rope (Interstitial Lung Disease) and had been declined as a candidate by four university transplant centers. I heard about St. Joseph's in Phoenix who specializes in transplants—lung, heart, kidney and liver.

I had two large oxygen concentrators and two

large compressors and six oxygen tanks plus everything we could cram into our SUV for the trip to Phoenix. Sue and I knew that it was beyond our abilities to unload the car every night, recharge the tanks for the day and load back in the car to make the trip, but we had to try.



I happened to call one of our members who had become a

very good friend over the years just to let him know that I was going to Phoenix to be evaluated for a lung transplant (2 weeks of testing). He asked if there was anything he could do to help and I told him he could help us load the car the morning we leave. Later, his wife spoke up to him and suggested that they escort Sue and I to Phoenix from the Seattle area in their motorhome. We told them we'd do it under one condition, that was we pay all of their expenses coming and going.

We started out with us driving our car, following our friends in their motorhome. They recharged oxygen tanks in their motorhome using their inverter while driving and again while sleeping at night. We also recharged tanks in our hotel room at night after our friends helped unload and reload the car every day. Whenever we stopped for the night, we tried to find a hotel/RV combination so we could be somewhat close by; most nights we were able to do that.

With our friends' help it took us 5 days to reach the Phoenix area. After testing and being approved for a double lung transplant, I found out that I also need a double heart bypass which will be done at the same time as the lung transplant. My condition has deteriorated in the 6 weeks we've been in Phoenix and my place on the waiting list has been upgraded so I can now expect to be called for a transplant within a few days.

Our friends wish to be anonymous in this newsletter so I will honor that. They are humble, caring, loving fellow Northwest Trek Fun Club members helping members and have given me the gift of a chance at a longer life.

Dean is recovering from a double-lung transplant and heart surgery that occurred in Arizona.







Hello Northwest Trek fun club members:

We are in the beginning stages of putting together another Port Townsend rally. Port Townsend has changed how they register sites for large groups. This really makes it much easier for us to have a large rally.

We're in the very early stages of planning right now. We are thinking of a 5-day rally probably starting Monday August 1st and departing Saturday August 6th. It might turn out to be the week before or the week after. This is August 2022.

Their new system requires you to register for your own site. The new system allows me to reserve as many sites as I want and YOU will have two weeks to pick your site. You'll have to sign in on the port's website, pick your own site, and register yourself. Registration fee is \$11 plus tax and it is nonrefundable. Registration will take place the first two weeks of the new year (2022). When you register, you will have a special code to use to reserve your site.

Also I'm looking for nine volunteers to help with this rally. They will take a very active part in the planning and making this a rally to remember. You will be involved in all parts of the rally. If you're interested in helping to put on what I hope will be a rally for the ages, please let me know of your interest. Part of your reward will be first crack at the front row in the loop.

Also let me know if you have a propane fire pit.





The FMCA Convention experience began with a meetup in Buffalo, Wyoming for 11 coaches July 3 - 4. Gary and Irva Cooper had planned to bring their SOB "Trek" but they had a plumbing valve issue and had to return to Poulsbo. Most were camped at the Buffalo KOA and the owners treated us very well.

On July 4 the group gathered for a hot dog roast and potluck. Information was shared about the convention, issues, and the caravan to Gillette on Monday morning. The only problem with the caravan that was led by Al Zimmerman was that he missed the first turn for the campground exit and had to unhook to backup. How embarrassing for the leader of the caravan. Oh well!

Tuesday was a briefing for Governing Board delegates on the issues to be decided on Wednesday. Al Zimmerman

represented NW Trek Fun Club as a national director. Elaine Zimmerman was a temporary delegate for the Southern Alberta Drifters (Canadian members were not able to cross the border to attend the convention.) A candidate's forum provided an opportunity to ask questions of those running for office.

Governing Board Meeting – Wednesday, July 7

Outgoing president, Jon Walker, reported there two achievements from his administration: 1) FMCA is sound financially and 2) membership is once again growing.

Most of the issues brought before the GB were to make minor changes to the bylaws and policies. Here were some significant actions:

- Annual dues were set at \$50 per year and members may renew for up to three years. Each year
 the GB sets the amount of the annual dues. The main reason annual dues could be set at \$50
 was the reasonable proposal from Chubb Insurance for the FMCAssist medical evacuation
 coverage.
- Dues for commercial members (vendors, manufacturers, campgrounds were also set at \$50 to encourage more commercial members.
- One proposal was to discourage Executive Board members from having meetings among themselves to discuss issues coming before the board. This was roundly defeated. It was felt that board members should discuss issues prior to formal meetings.
- Two proposals came from the Membership Engagement Committee regarding marketing and a
 revamped governing structure. These proposals were disliked by the majority present.
 Zimmerman proposed a replacement that called for marketing research on prospective
 membership groups and that study may have implications for a modification of the governing
 structure. This proposal passed unanimously.

Officer Elections were held at the end of the meeting.

Approximately 1,342 coaches were present for the convention. Next year's spring convention will be in Tucson, Arizona. The summer convention and GB meeting will be in Lincoln, Nebraska.
